Picnic at the Unicorn's

Overview	The children's task is to prepare a meal for a picnic at the Unicorn's for all friends.
Group size	Minimum 15 pupils
Learning objectives	Creating educational situations that build the child's sensitivity; discovering the common needs of different children.
Preparation, Materials	Previous introduction to the story and reminding conversation about it; Silhouettes (or symbols) of the characters in the story; Fresh fruit for skewers in as many bowls as many pairs or individuals working in a group; Skewer sticks
Others	You can turn making skewers into making sandwiches.

Guidelines for educators

1. Suggest that the children make fruit skewers for the Unicorn picnic.
2. Prepare the work places together (you know the children and know whether they can cut the fruit into pieces on their own or whether they will stuff them whole on sticks)
3. Give the children time to prepare the skewers.
4. When finished, assemble the skewers in one place and ask the children to estimate if there are enough for everyone present at the picnic.
5. Show the silhouettes of the characters in the story and ask the children to use any method to check whether each participant gets at least one skewer.

Debriefing/Reflection

Ask the children of the children to evaluate the result obtained.

Ask the children why it was important to see that each participant gets a skewer?

Tips for the educator

Reflect on the pedagogical objectives and possibilities of this activity.

Focus on the possibility to start talk with children about equal opportunities and rights for all children (or people) in the world.
